**CROSS-COUNTRY RUNNING**

**CLONLIFFE HARRIERS' SIX MILES CROSS-COUNTRY HANDICAP.**

This club event was decided on Saturday at Finglas Wood in wretched weather. The first to show prominently were J. Gorry, J. A. Sansom, and C. Farren (7 mins. 30 secs.), who led for about 1 1/2 miles, when they were overtaken by P. J. Howlin (7 mins.), who led up to about 4 miles of the distance. At this point J. D. McKeon (6 mins. 15 secs.) joined issue with the latter, the pair now being about 150 yards in front of V. Ryder (5 mins. 15 secs.), who is a twin brother to P. J. Ryder. McKeon up to this point was thought the likely winner, but failing to sustain the pace he set up early in the race, was passed about three-quarters of a mile from home by Ryder, who eventually won by 250 yards, 60 yards dividing second and third. B. Parker (30 secs.) accomplished the fastest time for the journey, viz., 37 mins. 17 secs., and finished seventh, the time of the virtual scratchman, P. Kelly, who finished ninth, being 37 mins. 35 secs., that of the winner being third best, viz., 38 mins. 45 secs. Result:—
